What's wrong Red Sea, that made you hurry out of their way? What happened, Jordan River, that you turned away? Why, mountains did you skip like rams? Why, hills like lambs?

Psalms 114:5&6.

The Red Sea had no choice, the Jordan River could not ignore the instruction of the Lord. The question the Psalmist is asking is rhetorical. The next couple verses speaks to the point. Tremble, O earth, at the presence of the Lord, at the presence of the God of Jacob. He turned the rock into a pool of water; yes, a spring of water flowed from solid rock.

I love these verses, they speak of the power and the authority of the God I worship and serve. They make me feel secure and they remind me I'm on the winning side. However a couple verses earlier in this text something catches my attention. In verse 3, it says the Red Sea saw them coming and hurried out of their way. Hmmm, that's not exactly how I remember it in scripture. I read in Exodus 14 the Israelites were seemingly backed up against the Red Sea with the pharaoh bearing down on them eager to destroy them. I read the Israelites lost faith and were even crying out that it would have been better for them to stay in Egypt rather then to die by the hand of pharaoh in the wilderness. I read they wished they were still slaves of Egypt. It doesn't exactly appear the Red Sea hurried out of their way, at least not to me it doesn't.

It looks to me like Moses had to calm the Israelites down, point them towards God, and then move forward with boldness and confidence before the sea would part.

But wait...isn't that the point. What should we do in those moments when the enemy is bearing down and we feel trapped. 1.Calm yourself before the Lord. 2. Fix your eyes on Him and look for His perspective not your own. 3. Move forward with God's confidence. Then watch God do what only He can do.

So the Psalmist did not stretch the truth to make Psalms 114 more exciting to read, like some people I know do when telling stories, I won't name names. Be encouraged today. No matter the circumstances God is in control. He has a plan. He is moving. His Kingdom is advancing. Sure pharaoh's army is getting closer, you can see them and hear their intentions to destroy. But Gods not worrying so why should you. Truth is, God lured pharaoh to that place. It was a set up. Egypt was the world power at that point, but never again. But God did not simply destroy the enemy. He also taught Israel something that day. Exodus 14:31 says, When the people saw the mighty power that the Lord had unleashed on the Egyptians they were filled with awe before Him. They put their faith in the Lord and in his servant Moses.

What is God trying to teach or stir up in you in this season of your life? More faith maybe? More trust? Maybe He is calling you to move forward in confidence because the sea in front of you is already destined to hurry out of the way for His glory to be revealed in your life. So what are you waiting for?


ALL CHURCH PICNIC

<u>Please register for this event by Sunday, March 7th</u> so we can plan accordingly for supplies needed. Registration is available at the Information center in the foyer.



Knights of North Castle: K-3rd Grade Day camp



Hearing God's Voice - Adele Graser

Growing up in the church, I was always hearing people say, "God told me…" or "I heard God say…" and I wondered what it was like to actually hear God. I thought it was amazing how many people in the Bible heard God and I thought it must've been so nice to clearly hear God and know what they were supposed to do. As I got older and started building my own relationship with God, I began to realize that hearing His voice took practice. I realized that everyone's experiences were slightly different but that most commonly God's voice is a quiet thought or a little nudge that requires we are purposefully listening for it.

Recently the Women's Ministry team hosted a "Time with God" event where we spent time worshipping God, praying together, and then praying on our own and listening for God's voice. It was such a refreshing time and so neat to hear how God revealed himself to different women in different ways. For some it was a verse that stood out, for others it was words of a song that tugged at their heart, still others heard His voice through the prayers of others over them, and some got words spoken to their hearts while journaling.

I know that there are many who are struggling right now and maybe even feeling like God is distant and not speaking. It can be hard to hear His voice amid confusion, pain, anxiety, depression, loneliness, or any other battle you're fighting, but it is in those moments that God desperately wants us to be listening for Him. We serve a God who wants an intimate relationship with us and who has specific words for us to help us not only survive those battles but to be victorious.

Priscilla Shirer wrote a bible study called "Discerning the Voice of God" that provides some good direction on how to hear God's voice. One of the first things she says is "Hearing Him starts with our commitment to humble obedience. We won't do it perfectly – we can't always obey flawlessly – but we must do it purposefully." That is a critical part of hearing Him. If you are scared of what He might tell you or don't know that you'll be willing to follow through, it is going to be a lot harder to hear Him. You have to be willing to trust Him and to obey.

One of the first times I remember specifically hearing from God was after I admitted to Him that I was scared to let go of my dreams and give Him full control to do as he wanted with my life. He first reminded me who He was: all powerful, all knowing, creator and God. Then He reminded me what He had done for me: sent His son to die for me even when I was unwilling to give Him my all and then poured many other blessings over me. Finally, He said "Knowing this, don't you think my plans for you will be so much better than any you can come up with yourself?" It was in that moment that I realized how much I was hurting myself when I didn't fully trust God and give Him control. While I haven't always obeyed or always let go since then, I have learned to trust Him even when my expectations of how my life should go haven't always been met.

Hearing God's Voice - Adele Graser

Once you're ready to start trusting Him and trying to obey, you are ready to start practicing hearing His voice. Priscilla Shirer gives some good advice on how to do this:

- 1. Intentionally listen take time to be still and consciously turn your attention inward to see if what you're sensing carries the weight of God. Discernment takes time, patience, and practice.
- 2. Don't talk to others about anything more than you talk to God about it. If there is something you think you may have heard from Him, submit it back to Him in prayer instead of worrying over it or trying to overanalyze it.
- 3. Carefully consider what the Bible says. Does what you think you're hearing contradict the character of God or His word in any way?
- 4. Seek the counsel of a wise, more mature believer who is practiced in discerning God's voice.
- 5. Ask the Lord to confirm His internal word with external evidence. He <u>wants</u> you to know His will and won't be hiding it from you. He will graciously verify His message through His word, circumstances, or another person.
- 6. Don't be afraid of making mistakes. These are often the greatest teachers to help us learn to discern Him more clearly in the future.

Being a perfectionist, that last point has been one of the hardest for me. However, I can speak from experience that God is faithful to redeem those mistakes when they are done with a heart of trying to obey Him.

If you are earnestly seeking His voice and feel that you aren't hearing anything, I would encourage you to spend some time studying His character. Learn who He is and trusting Him and hearing Him will become easier. Also, don't hesitate to reach out to a pastor, elder, or one of us on the Women's Ministry leadership team. We would love to help you!

BUILD update

In September, we began our two-year BUILD program in a new location on the

Rosebud reservation in South Dakota. Although the October class had to be cancelled because the reservation went into lockdown for a few weeks, we praise God that we've been able to hold two classes so far. Another module is scheduled for the week before Christmas, Lord willing.

Open doors through tech

The COVID-19 pandemic has opened exciting doors for both BUILD and Mokahum by forcing us to think creatively: *How can we build the church among more Native American people, even if we're not able to be physically present with them?* Our experiences during the shutdown last spring, when we had to move all of our Mokahum classes online, led to a new idea: opening an extension of Mokahum at Hands of Faith, a ministry near Pine Ridge, South Dakota. (Hands of Faith is a discipleship ministry where we held our previous series of BUILD classes.) We envision Hands of Faith residents auditing Mokahum classes live via Zoom. We hope to try this next fall when

we're back in session.

Meanwhile, through the generosity of a donor, we recently purchased video equipment and have started recording all of the BUILD classes now being held in Rosebud. In the end, we will have a set of professionally produced teaching videos that can be used for BUILD training by qualified facilitators on

> other reservations, thus multiplying the future reach of the ministry.

United in Christ reboot

The United in Christ conference planned for this past summer has been rescheduled to

July 15-17, 2021. Our current plan is to hold an outdoor conference at Oak Hills Christian College. In the meantime, we're hosting monthly online miniconferences in partnership with CHIEF to provide encouragement for Native believers and those in Native ministry.
